

## Collection of vaccination stickers for fully vaccinated short-term visitors

### FAQs

#### **Q:**

Who can obtain the vaccination sticker from ICA?

Groups	Eligibility
Fully vaccinated overseas with two doses of the same WHO-EUL Vaccine	Short-term visitors who do not currently have a vaccination sticker can obtain one from ICA.  Singapore citizens, permanent residents, long-term pass holders <u>will not be eligible</u> . You will need to take a serology test at a clinic at the following link ( <a href="https://go.gov.sg/clinicsforserology">go.gov.sg/clinicsforserology</a> ) to have your vaccination records ingested into the National Immunisation Registry (NIR).
Fully vaccinated with two mixed doses of the WHO-EUL vaccine	Singapore citizens, permanent residents, long-term pass holders and short-term visitors can obtain the vaccination stickers from ICA.

Eligible travellers can visit Level 2 Information Counter, at ICA Building, to request for a vaccination sticker. The requester's passports and vaccination certificates (original) must be produced for ICA officers' assessment.

#### **Q: Is there a validity date for the vaccination sticker? What if I need to stay in Singapore after expiry of the sticker?**

A: The vaccination sticker is valid from now until 30 Sep 2021. Travellers who are staying in Singapore beyond 30 Sep 2021, or plan to remain in Singapore beyond 30 days, will need to take a serology test at a clinic at the following link ([go.gov.sg/clinicsforserology](https://go.gov.sg/clinicsforserology)) to have your vaccination records ingested into the National Immunisation Registry (NIR). Following this, your vaccination status will be reflected in your TraceTogether app.

#### **Q: I was unable to fulfil the 14-day fully vaccinated requirement when I arrived at the checkpoint. Now that I have fulfilled the 14-day requirement, can I obtain a vaccination sticker from ICA HQ?**

A: Yes, travellers who entered Singapore and are fully vaccinated<sup>+</sup>, can visit Level 2 Information Counter, at ICA Building, to request for a vaccination sticker. The requester's passports and vaccination certificates (original) must be produced for ICA officers' assessment.

*+ An individual is considered fully vaccinated two weeks after receiving the full regiment of Pfizer-BioNTech/Comirnaty, Moderna or other WHO EUL vaccines.*

#### **Q: The Ministry of Health (MOH) has announced vaccination stickers will be issued at ICA checkpoints upon arrival from 21 Aug 2021. Can I still obtain a vaccination sticker if I had arrived before 21 Aug 2021 and have been fully vaccinated overseas?**

A: Yes, travellers who entered Singapore prior to 21 Aug 2021, and are fully vaccinated<sup>+</sup>, can visit Level 2 Information Counter, at ICA Building, to request for a vaccination sticker. The requester's passports and vaccination certificates (original) must be produced for ICA officers' assessment.

+ An individual is considered fully vaccinated two weeks after receiving the full regimen of Pfizer-BioNTech/Comirnaty, Moderna or other WHO EUL vaccines.

**Q: What is the eligibility criteria to collect the vaccination sticker from ICAB?**

A: The traveller must be the rightful holder of the overseas-issued vaccination certificate, both digital or hardcopy are acceptable (i.e. name matches biodata shown in the passport). The date of the last dose of vaccination administration is at least 14 days before the date of sticker collection.

Types of vaccine used must be on the World Health Organisation Emergency Use Listing (WHO-EUL) list.

Mixed dose vaccinations require two doses of any combination of these vaccines, except for Johnson & Johnson/Janssen, which requires only one dose:

- i. Pfizer-BioNtech/Comirnaty
- ii. Moderna
- iii. Johnson & Johnson/Janssen
- iv. Oxford-AstraZeneca/Vaxzevria
- v. Serum Institute of India/Covishield
- vi. Sinopharm
- vii. Sinovac

+ All WHO-EUL vaccines require two doses of the same type of vaccine except for Johnson & Johnson/Janssen, which requires only one dose.

**Q: Besides the overseas vaccination certificate and passport, what other documents do I need to bring along for collection of the vaccination sticker?**

A: *The traveller must furnish their passport and a valid, English-language vaccination certificate.*

**Q: Where is the venue and what is the operating hours for collection of vaccination stickers?**

A: Travellers can approach Level 2 Information Counter, at ICA Building, to request for a vaccination sticker, from 8:00 am to 4:30 pm (Mondays to Fridays), 8:00 am to 12:30pm (Saturdays).

**Q: Must I turn up in person to receive the vaccination sticker? Or can I authorise someone else to do so?**

A: The requester need not turn up in person. His family or friends can receive the vaccination sticker on his behalf, if they produce his passport and overseas vaccination certificate (original) must be produced to ICA officer. In view of the COVID-19 situation, members of the public are encouraged to limit the number of accompanying visitors to ICA Building.

**Q: My overseas vaccination certificate is not in English, can ICA accept it?**

A: No, ICA is unable to process overseas vaccination certificates that are not in English.

**Q: I have translated my overseas vaccination certificated into English. Can ICA accept it?**

A: *For vaccination certificates that are not in English, the traveller will be required to furnish both the original and translated copies. The certificate can be translated into English by the embassy or a public notary.*

**Q: Can I remove the sticker by myself after 30 Sep 2021 when the sticker expires?**

A: Yes, you may wish to remove the sticker as it will no longer be valid for use in Singapore.

**Q: Do I need to make an appointment or can I walk in?**

*A: No appointment is required.*

**Q: How long will it take for the issuance of sticker?**

*A: The issuance of the sticker is expected to be completed within 10 mins.*

**Q: Does having the sticker means the status will be reflected in TraceTogether?**

*A: For individuals vaccinated overseas, a serology test is required to have the vaccination status reflected in TraceTogether.*

**Q: If my vaccination status is reflected in TraceTogether, does that mean for future visits to Singapore, I will not need to furnish any vaccination certificate to prove my vaccination status?**

*A: Travellers who are vaccinated overseas and have tested serology positive in Singapore may produce their TraceTogether app in lieu of vaccination certificate as proof of their vaccination status for future visits to Singapore*

**Q: What is the vaccination window to qualify for the sticker? E.g. I am vaccinated more than 6 months ago, am I eligible for the sticker?**

*A: At the moment, all fully vaccinated<sup>+</sup> individuals will qualify for the vaccination sticker.*

*+ An individual is considered fully vaccinated two weeks after receiving the full regimen of Pfizer-BioNTech/Comirnaty, Moderna or other WHO EUL vaccines.*
